BICYCLING IN THE PIONEER VALLEY

In 2025, the Pioneer Valley Planning Commission (PVPC) partnered again with various public and private organizations to encourage bicycling in the Pioneer Valley. In collaboration with municipalities, advocacy groups, and businesses, PVPC promoted public awareness and advocated for policies and programs that encourage bicycling.

BIKE MONTH OVERVIEW

INTRODUCTION

PVPC has been raising awareness about the importance of bicycling through working with local coordinators to organize and schedule a month filled with bike related events in Hampden and Hampshire counties. The effort aims at galvanizing the energy of local government officials, promoting events in various media outlets, recruiting citizen volunteers, and encouraging the participation of local businesses.

Events for Bay State Bike Month 2025 were held from Wednesday, April 30th to Saturday, May 31st. This is the 26th year that the Pioneer Valley Planning Commission has coordinated this initiative in the Pioneer Valley region.

During the past several years, MassBike has taken a lead role in organizing a statewide initiative among biking groups across the state of Massachusetts. MassBike maintains a dedicated website page for Bike Month and encourages event hosts to list their event happenings throughout the state there. The website offers interested folks a one-stop shop to locate nearby bike events. MassBike also promotes a Bike to Work Week during the dates designated by the American League of Cyclists, which has been the impetus for past Bike Commute Week events in the Pioneer Valley and Massachusetts.

PVPC staff created a poster listing local bike events in the Pioneer Valley Region during Bay State Bike Month 2025 and posted it on the PVPC's agency website. Upon request, PVPC staff printed color copies of the poster and dropped them off to various local partners to help spread the word out and assist in advertising the various events happening throughout the valley. This year's events included the popular bike breakfast hosted by a few partners in the region during Bike Month featuring sponsorships by local food businesses. Again, there will be a self-guided activity to allow people to take part at their own pace and comfort level.

EVENTS AND HOST COMMUNITIES

Planning meetings for Bay State Bike Month began in April 2025. Members of various partner organizations continued to drop in at the weekly virtual meeting facilitated by PVPC staff. This offered members of the various Bike Month events hosts a space to connect and share advice and collaborate in some of the scheduled events. Most hosts were very skilled event organizers, and quite able to develop a series of bike month events for their own community without need for consultation. A new non-profit organization partner reached out to PVPC for help in organizing a Bike Rodeo and staff connected them with the local MassBike staff who identified a skilled trainer. MassBike was instrumental in keeping the group appraised of new events being posted to their bike-friendly virtual calendar of events hosted by the MassBike website.

Several trail advocacy agencies and bike clubs joined the efforts of the statewide annual Bike Month held in May. Some bike partners synchronized their efforts with dates posted by the League of American Bicyclists who designated May 12th to the 18th of 2025 as Bike to Work Week.

Bike Month events aim to encourage Pioneer Valley residents to get on their bikes or feet and replace some car trips with alternative active modes of transportation that promote good health and reduce greenhouse gases emitted by motorized vehicles. Two of the popular bike

events are the Mayor's ride and Community Bike Breakfast. The Great Tree Bicycle Tour offered both a guided group activity as well as a self-paced option. Such annual events have been effective in engaging community members of all ages and abilities. Several organizations collaborated in celebrating earth day and helped their communities gear up for bike month by hosting ValleyBike demos just before Bike Month officially began. Some event hosts partnered with local businesses to offer discounts to customers who arrive by bike wearing a bike helmet as a proof during certain days of Bike Month. Two such businesses in the City of Westfield were Circuit Coffee and Chrissy G's Bakery and Pastry Shop. More communities could take advantage of such partnership as both Northampton and Amherst did in past years.

Some 23 events were held during the 2025 Bay State Bike Month in the Pioneer Valley. These events took place in Amherst, East Longmeadow, Greenfield, Northampton, Springfield, South Deerfield, Westfield and Williamsburg. Events occurred during various times and days to reach as many bicycle enthusiasts and potential cyclists as possible. In order of occurrence, local events included the following:

The Friends of Northampton Trails (FNT) group is the lead organizer for this annual Bike Breakfast event which included speakers, tent booths of various organizations, bicycle businesses and sponsors. Some of the organizations represented were: MassBike, UMass Minutemen, New England Mountain Bike Association, Northampton Cycling Club (NCC), Speed and Sprocket Cycle Works, Strong Towns Northampton, Northampton City Planning Office, the Pioneer Valley Transit Authority (PVTA), the Pioneer Valley Planning Commission (PVPC) and ValleyBike.

The second image on the next page after is of the PVPC information table near the Westfield City Hall in conjunction with other Booths at the gathering spot of the Start and Finish of the Mayor's Ride event. These initiatives encourage mobility independence using transportation alternatives to the single occupancy vehicle. Various educational events during this month equip people with skills and knowledge that encourage them to commute by bike and introduce familiarity with bike transport to make biking part of their regular travel.

PARTICIPATION

There was very good participation in some of the new Bike Month activities and the usual level of attendance at recurrent popular annual events. Participants displayed a wide range of riding levels and motivations for riding bicycles. This shows the continued success of initiatives that raise awareness about the importance of bicycling in the Pioneer Valley. It also demonstrates the need for ongoing and sustained funding for bicycle infrastructure, improvements to trails, safety education, and bicycling activities in the Pioneer Valley.

New partners joined the month-long initiative this year. The new list included business sponsors, collaborators, and bike advocates. They offered a few more inclusive events to facilitate engaging people of all abilities. 


A List of events by community is displayed in a table on the next page. The total number of participants at this year's Bike Month events was 790, as estimated by hosts at 22 events. Last year, event partners reported an estimate of 548 participants at 17 reported events. Averaging event attendance per year, we can compare attendance last year with this year and see growth from 32.24 to 35.91 in average event participation. This represents an approximate 11.5% increase in participation. The rate of growth in participation is affected by the four uncounted events from last year. However, the large attendance in the current year at some of the new events is undeniably a good sign of the success of the continued collaborative effort of planning a series of events to celebrate Bike Month in the Pioneer Valley in encouraging people to bike.

GIVE-AWAY MATERIALS

Bay state Bike Month themed stickers as well as MassBike stickers were made available again this year by MassBike at select event locations. A coloring page of the Logo was posted for printing at the MassBike's Bike Month page on their website. Additional educational stickers by the Brain Injury Association of Massachusetts were available at the PVPC informational tables during Bike Month to promote the importance of wearing a helmet in protecting cyclists from potential brain injury in the event of a crash. MassBike also offered reflective adjustable bands that can be worn on arms or legs to add visibility to cyclists and walkers at night. 

MassBike's Bay State Bike Month 2025 Logo Design (left), MassBike Reflective Bands (right)


WEBSITE AND SOCIAL MEDIA








WESTFIELD, Mass. (WWLP) – The 16th annual 'Mayor's Bike Ride' is scheduled to take place Wednesday evening.

Again, this year, the poster included a QR code to facilitate easy access to the electronic version of an upto-date calendar of events. The digital copy of the poster included hyperlinks to event details furnished by event organizers. Event announcements directed people to seek further information from MassBike's website: https://www.baystatebikemonth.org/. Therefore, the website was an easy-to-use tool for providing additional event information.



committee that convenes about six weeks ahead of Bike month each year to ensure that their future events are included in our regional promotional efforts.






Poster Flyers of Bike Rodeo Event in East Longmeadow

FUTURE GOALS

PVPC staff worked with Bike Month organizers and the Pioneer Valley Joint Transportation's Bicycle, Pedestrian and Complete Streets (BPCS) Sub-Committee to establish the following goals for future events to celebrate the annual Bike Month.

- Work with the BPCS sub-committee to identify new communities to engage in future Bike Week Events for next year.
- Work with MassBike to develop and promote new events for next year.
- Continue to augment the database of contacts of partner organizations and individuals and parties interested in bike month by adding the list of bike shops received from one of the event hosts and other lists of bike enthusiasts.
- Consider holding some in-person event planning meetings either at the offices of the PVPC or offer to join local meetings of partner organizations to encourage participation of new organizations.
- Talk to the Age Friendly Pioneer Valley Committee to encourage participation in Bike Month Planning and discuss how to remove potential technical barriers. Reach out to the aging friendly community to assess interest in participating in the planning of events.
- During the planning stage, remind participating event hosts to include groups of people with disabilities in their outreach efforts.
- Continue to encourage hosting of family friendly events as an opportunity to educate and
 promote the next generation of riders throughout the region. The monthly recurrence of
 the Northampton Bike Party is an effective way to build community. Building on critical
 mass rides nationwide, the local initiative has turned into a social gathering including some
 treats at the completion of a casual group ride down the main street of a community.
- Address the issue of the current text-heavy poster due to the doubling of number of event
 offerings which happened after event offerings expanded to a month from the original
 week. The use of a graphic with a QR code pointing to a detailed schedule of events could
 improve on communicating information about Bike Month.
- Remind communities of the opportunity to create their own sub-regional posters. This
 would allow for the creation of lists of fewer events close to where the poster is being hung.
 An example would be to group Easthampton, Holyoke and Northampton events in one
 poster. Another option could be of east of the river events versus west of the river events
 posters.
- Another idea is to color code events or group them by town/city to easily identify event locations in a busy poster or print the poster on larger size paper than the current 11" x 14'.


- Use educational graphics that focus on health benefits to all ages, while promoting a multimodal transportation network to offer alternative transportation choices within the pioneer valley.
- Increase organization and coordination around the information being presented and other
 potential activities during the bike breakfast events to incorporate an educational
 component. Work more with the local bike shops for this event.
- Help increase the presence of bikeshare representation at bike month events.
- Connect with the college and university population to get interested student clubs and individuals involved before finals' week, when their end of semester activities usually concludes in the first week of May.
- Seek more media coverage to announce happenings before events by additional media outlets and platforms, especially newspapers and local radio station. Some local news agencies include The Daily Hampshire Gazette, MassLive, The Reminder, The Republican, and the Westfield News.
- Continue efforts in social media coverage to promote Bike Month events. Increase the use
 of the PVPC Social Media Accounts to advertise and promote Bike Month. Include PVPC
 social media handles at select Bike Month events to increase followers.
- Continue to work on improving the ability to promote events. Use flyers and mail out postcards, as well as public service announcements via local radio.
- Continue working with communities to help them promote their events.









BIKE TOUR MAP
